

As a director, favorite Vermont Stage credits include the world premieres of *Doublewide* by Stephen Spotswood and *The Quarry* by Greg Pierce (*slowgirl, The Landing*), *The Clean House* by Sarah Ruhl, *Venus In Fur* by David Ives, *Vanya and Sonia and Masha and Spike* by Christopher Durang, *Dancing Lessons* by Mark St. Germain, *The Mountaintop* by Katori Hall, and *The Call* by Tanya Barfield. Prior to her arrival in Burlington, Cristina spent a year working as Assistant to the Managing Director at Woolly Mammoth Theatre Company and 10 years as a freelance director. Over the years, she has had the pleasure of working with The Ensemble Studio Theatre, The Culture Project, Forum Theatre DC, The American Globe Theatre, the FringeNYC Festival, Theatre Rhinoceros, Next Stop Theatre, University of Vermont, and Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park. Cristina was a finalist for a Denham fellowship given by the Society of Directors and Choreographers and is a member of the Lincoln Center Theater Directors Lab. Bachelor of Arts, Theatre, George Mason University.



She is a college student entering her senior year at SUNY Fredonia, pursuing a BFA in acting with minors in creative writing and dance. 




BIOGRAPHIES



PATRICK CLOW (Actor 1) - Patrick has been acting and directing on area stages for over 25 years. He's performed with Vermont Stage Company, Girls Nite Out Productions, Middlebury Actor's Workshop, Lyric Theatre Company, Saints and Poets Productions, Stowe Theatre Guild, and others. You may have seen him in a handful of VSC Bake-offs or Winter Tales. He directed Lyric's productions of The Secret Garden, The Full Monty, and Hairspray. Other notable roles include Stowe's Sweeney Todd as 'Sweeney,' S&P's O Caligula as 'Macro,' Lyric's Oliver as 'Fagin,' and originating Carole Vasta-Folley's 'Smith' in GNOP's Sleepover.

SARAH MELL (Actor 2) - Sarah Mell has been active in the Vermont theatre scene since 2005, performing with Waterbury Festival Playhouse, Saints & Poets Production Company, Middlebury Actors Workshop, Lyric Theatre Company, Vermont Shakespeare Festival, and Vermont Stage Company. Over the course of their acting career thus far, Sarah's most memorable roles include a goat, a unicorn, and an egret - all roles that were written outside the confines of gender. When Sarah does play a human role, they advocate for casting beyond gendered expectations. They are elated by the challenge and jubilation offered in Popcorn Falls and determined that this small town will be saved

(and their true talents discovered) by this opportunity to play with VT Stage. Sarah is indebted to her talented and patient sibling who has always encouraged her to explore the characters living in her head - here are about 12 for you, Heather.

HARRY CHAIKIN (Sound Designer) - Harry Chaikin has been a musician and sound guy around Burlington for over forty years!

CORA FAUSER (Costume Designer) - Cora Fauser first pricked her costume finger at UVM's Arena Theater when it was in the basement of the Fleming Museum. She followed her costume and set designer husband for 20 years, backing up his inspired work whenever there was a special project. She has been privileged to costume productions on her own (always in collaboration with many supportive friends, of course!!) since 1994 for Burlington High School, Champlain College, Lost Nation Theater, Theatre Kavanah, Shelburne Players, Monteverdi Music School, and Vermont Stage. She even dressed our versatile Sarah Mell's Egret in Blackberry Winter. She has very much enjoyed the process of costuming this deceptively minimal, home-made Popcorn Falls.

JAMES HINDMAN (Playwright) -James Hindman is an award-winning playwright and actor. As a writer, his New York credits include: Popcorn Falls, directed by two-time Tony Award Winner Christian Borle (Top Twenty Theatrical Moments of 2018); Pete 'n' Keely (Outer Critics Award nomination, two Drama Desk nominations); The Audience (Drama Desk nomination); Being Audrey (Transport Group, NEA Grant recipient); A Christmas Survival Guide; The Gorges Motel (NYFringe Festival 2016) and his one-man show, What Doesn't Kill You. His plays have been developed at Second Stage, The Vineyard, The Barrow Group, The Lark and Transport Group.

His other work includes *Multiple Family Dwelling* (New Jersey Rep, chosen "Top 10 New Jersey Productions of 2017"); *The Bikinis* (Long Wharf, Goodspeed Musicals); *The Drama Department* (Terrence McNally Award finalist) and *Heaven Help Us* (Denver Center, Carbonell Award nomination). Many of his ten-minute plays and monologues have been published in anthologies. He is a member of The Dramatist Guild of America and a substitute teacher for Playwriting at The Barrow Group.

As a performer: Oceans 8, Marvel's Iron Fist, The Americans, recurring role on Steven Spielberg's Public Morals, Madam Secretary, Forever, Believe, Person of Interest, Hostages, House of Cards, Henry's Crime, The Sopranos, Law and Order, SVU, CI, Rescue Me and The Blacklist. Broadway and tours: Mary Poppins, The Scarlet Pimpernel, 1776, City of Angels, A Grand Night For Singing, Once Upon A Mattress, Falsettos and Dancing At Lughnasa.

ISAAK OLSON (Audio Technician) - Isaak is a theater technician with expertise in Lighting and Audio. He is currently a rising Junior at the Boston University School of Theatre, where he is pursuing a BFA in Lighting Design. His credits there include Lighting Designer for Far Away, Master Electrician for Mansfield Park, and Co-Master Electrician for Walking the Tightrope. In addition to his studies, he also works as an IT Support Specialist and Event Technician for the University's IT Department. He has worn a variety of other hats throughout the years, including Audio-Visual Assistant at Essex High School (EHS), Student Tech Director for the Vermont State One-Act Festival, and Calling Stage Manager for EHS's productions of Les Misérables, Urinetown, Frankenstein, and Big Fish.

KATELYN PADDOCK (Production Stage Manager)- Katelyn is happy to be back for her third show with Vermont Stage, having previously worked on *The Legend of Georgia McBride* (PSM) and the Bake-Off of *Private Lives* (Victor).
